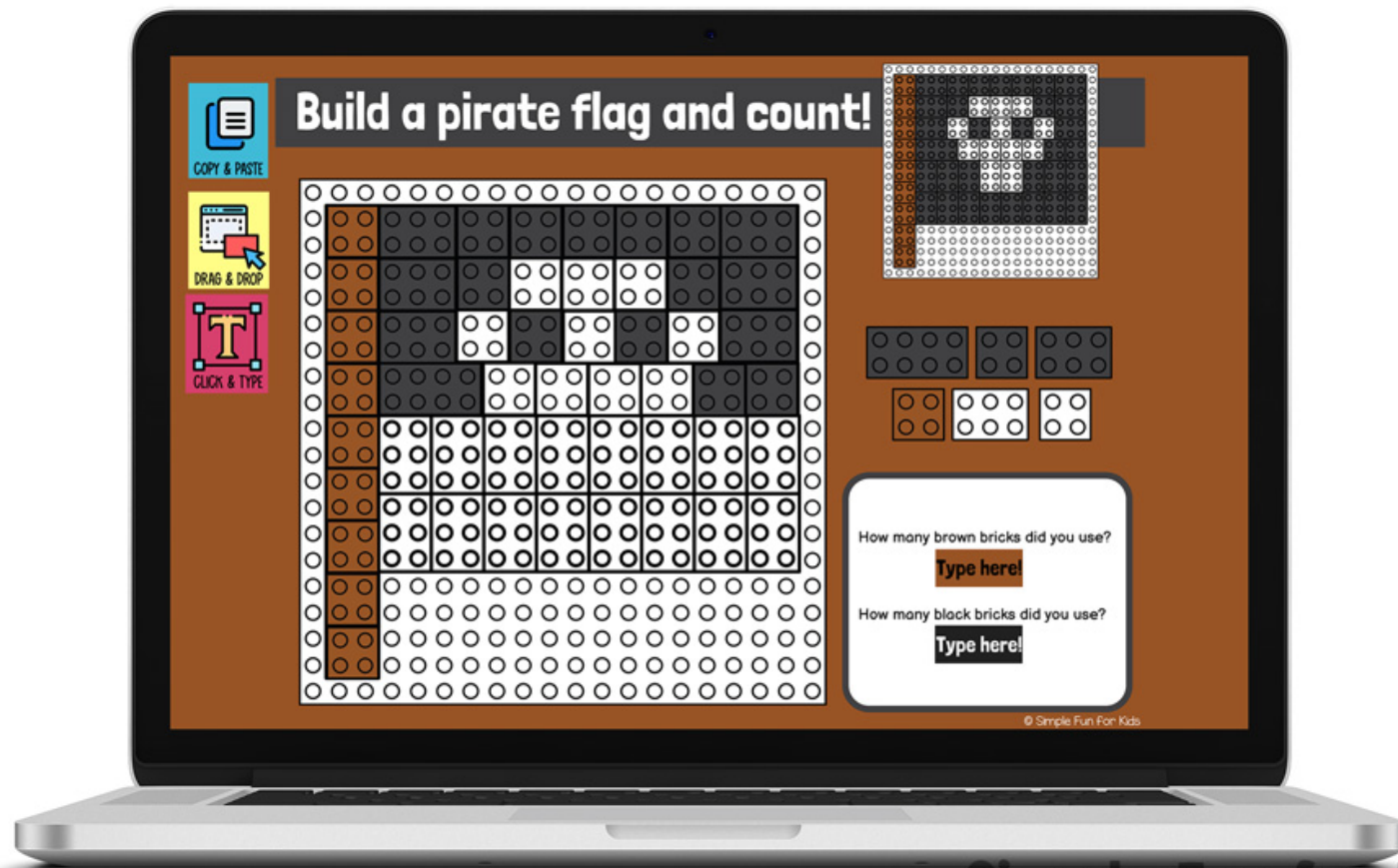


# DIGITAL LEGO Pirates Challenge

## Digital Activity FOR GOOGLE SLIDES™



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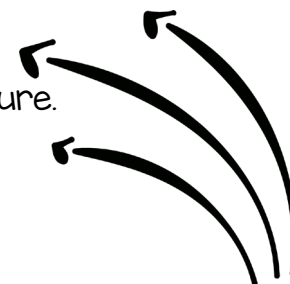
## Instructions

### Teacher:

- Go to page 4 and click the link to make a copy of the digital file in your Google Drive. Make sure you're using the correct Google account that corresponds to your Google Classroom setup (if needed).
- Delete the features slide (it's there to remind you of the features the activity has; students won't need it).
- Choose the page(s) you want to use in the current session.
- Make any required edits to your chosen slide(s). You can edit the text and everything inside the white boxes at the bottom right by using „View -> Master“ in Google Slides. Any edits you make in Master View will be visible to students in edit mode but can't be changed in that mode. This way, you can use your own questions, colors, etc. and still have all elements that students aren't supposed to interact with locked down in edit mode. (Please note that the LEGO templates and backgrounds are flattened and can't be extracted or edited.)
- Assign the page(s) to your students.

### Student:

- Make sure you're in edit mode, not presentation mode
- Drag and drop LEGO bricks in the correct spots on the blank template to make a picture like the one at the top right of the page. (Absolute precision isn't required.)
- Copy and paste the LEGO bricks on the right-hand side to make enough to complete each picture.
- Count how many bricks of each color you used and enter the number in the text boxes.



Student instructions are also included in the notes on each slide.

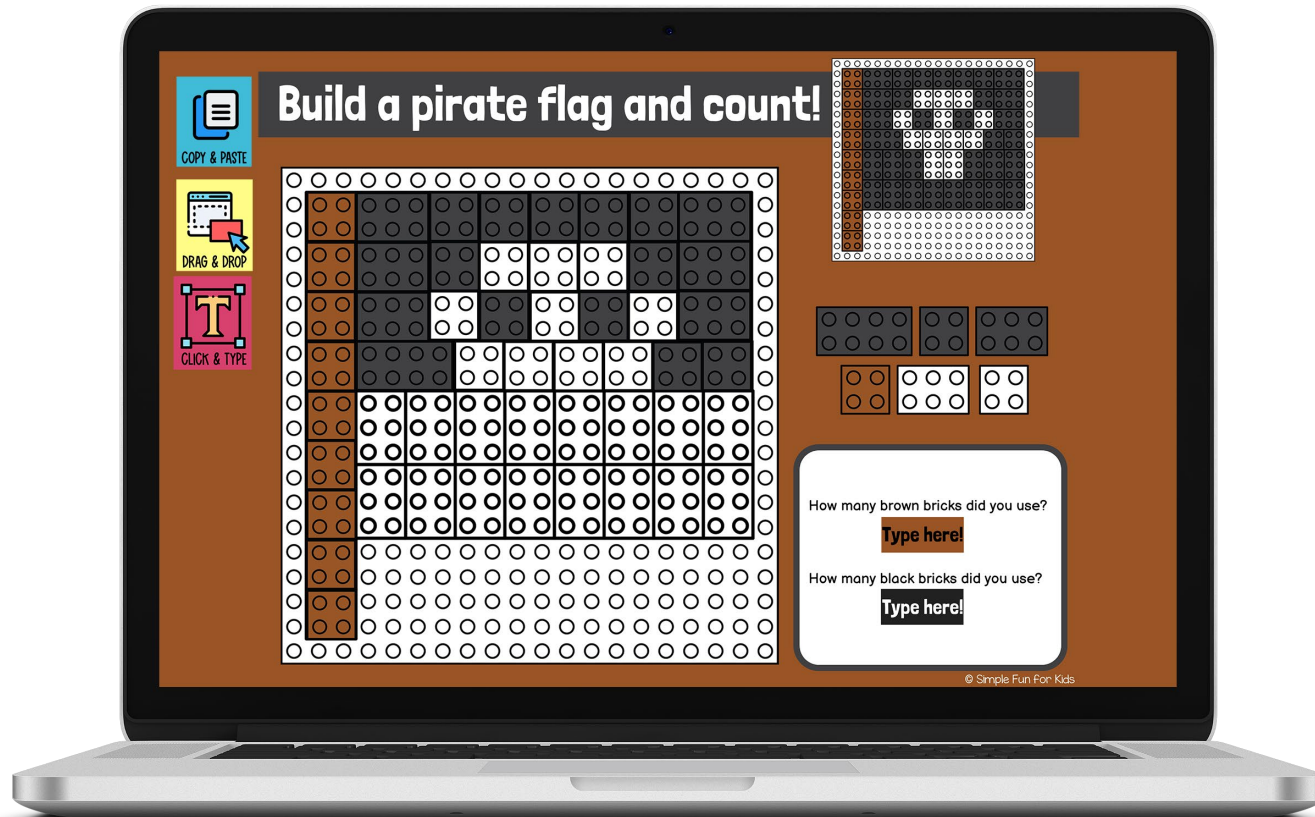

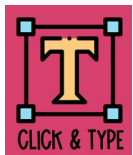
